## Introducing the Port Replicator


Congratulations! With the OmniBook Port Replicator, you can significantly increase the convenience of your OmniBook for desktop use. By making one connection—plugging your OmniBook into the dock—you can get easy access to these types of devices:

- Printer, external floppy drive, or other parallel device.
- Universal serial bus (USB) devices.
- External keyboard and mouse.
- External monitor.
- Local area network (RJ45 LAN port Model F1745A only)
- Audio connections.

### Port replicator front and rear views



## Docking the OmniBook

1. Plug the power cord into the ac adapter, then into an ac outlet. Plug the ac adapter into the port replicator.

The ac power indicator (Model 1738A only) lights when you have a good connection.



#### Note

The ac power adapter is not included with the port replicator. Use the ac power adapter supplied with your OmniBook or you can buy an additional ac power adapter. See your OmniBook *Setup Guide* for details.


You can use your OmniBook in the port.replicator using battery power. The ac power indicator (Model 1738A only) does not light in this operating mode.

### Using the Port Replicator

### Docking the OmniBook


- 2. Position the OmniBook on the port replicator, aligning the two docking guideposts on the port replicator with the matching holes on the bottom of the OmniBook.
- 3. Press down on the OmniBook.

The docking indicator turns on when you have a good connection.



## Undocking the OmniBook

- 1. Exit any applications that are using devices that are connected through the port replicator.
- 2. Press the release tabs on each side of the port replicator and gently lift the OmniBook up.



**CAUTION** 

Make sure both sides of the OmniBook are released from the port replicator before lifting the OmniBook.

## To secure your port replicator

Your port replicator has a built-in locking slot (see page 4) that allows you to secure the port replicator with a cable. A Kensington lock system or compatible lock system works with this slot and is available at many computer stores.

Note

This lock does not secure the OmniBook. You will need a second lock system to secure your OmniBook.

## **Making Connections**

The following paragraphs provide a brief description about how to connect devices to the port replicator. For detailed information about using devices with your OmniBook, see the online *User's Guide* provided with your OmniBook or go to the OmniBook website at http://www.hp.com/omnibook or http://www.europe.hp.com/omnibook.

### Connecting a printer (or other parallel device)

The parallel port uses a standard 25-pin connector, most commonly used for connecting a printer.

• Connect the parallel printer cable or other parallel cable to the parallel port.

### Connecting an external keyboard or PS/2 mouse

The two 6-pin PS/2 ports allow you to attach an external keyboard or a PS/2-compatible mouse to the port replicator. While an external PS/2 mouse is connected, the pointing device on the OmniBook is normally disabled.

- Plug the mouse or keyboard PS/2 cable into the corresponding PS/2 port on the port replicator.
- To connect a device that has a PC-type jack, first connect its cable to an adapter cable with a PS/2 jack.

## Connecting a USB device

The universal serial bus (USB) provides a bidirectional serial interface for adding peripheral devices such as game controllers, serial and parallel ports, and scanners on a single bus. The port replicator provides two USB ports.

Attach the USB cable to one of the two USB ports. Windows 98
 automatically recognizes the USB device. Some USB devices can be
 connected to the port replicator in a series of USB devices—this is called a
 "daisy-chain" connection.

### Connecting to a LAN (Model F1745A only)

Connect your LAN cable to the RJ45 LAN port on the rear of the port replicator. When the port replicator is connected to an active LAN port, the LAN connect indicator is lit.

## Connecting audio devices

You can plug a stereo input source (such as a CD player), an external microphone, and external speakers or headphones into the audio ports on the port replicator.

• Attach the audio cable to the corresponding audio port.

Note

When you plug a device into the microphone-in port, the OmniBook's built-in microphone automatically turns off. When you plug a device into the speaker-out port, the OmniBook's built-in speakers automatically turn off.

#### **Making Connections**

## Connecting an external monitor

- 1. From the Start menu, shut down the OmniBook.
- 2. Connect the monitor cable from the monitor to the monitor port on the port replicator.
- 3. Connect the monitor to a power source and turn it on.
- 4. Press the blue power button to turn on the OmniBook.

To switch the display to the external monitor:

• Close the OmniBook lid.

-or-

• Press Fn+F12 (or CTRL+ALT+F12 on an external keyboard) to switch through the display options: display only, display and external monitor, external monitor only.

## **Troubleshooting**

If you have a problem using the port replicator, try the following suggestions. You will find solutions to additional common problems and troubleshooting techniques on the HP OmniBook website, www.hp.com/omnibook (www.europe.hp.com - European mirror).

#### If a connection does not work

- Try connecting the device to the corresponding port on the OmniBook. This can tell you if the problem is with the port replicator.
- Make sure the OmniBook is fully inserted in the port replicator. The connection should be snug.
- Make sure the ends of the device cable are connected properly.
- Make sure the device and the dock are connected and both have power connected and turned on.
- Reboot the OmniBook.

#### If an external PS/2 mouse or keyboard does not work

- Make sure the mouse or keyboard is plugged into the correct port. The mouse and keyboard ports look the same. See page 4.
- Check that the PS/2 mouse is enabled in the BIOS Setup utility.

#### If you cannot hear audio devices or files

- Check your OmniBook setup to make sure that the audio is not muted.
- Try increasing the volume. Fn + UP ARROW increases the volume.

## Regulatory information

This section presents information that shows how the port replicator complies with regulations in certain regions. Any modifications to the port replicator not expressly approved by Hewlett-Packard could void the authority to operate the port replicator in these regions.

### U.S.A

The port replicator generates and uses radio frequency energy and may interfere with radio and television reception. The port replicator complies with the limits for a Class B computing device as specified in Part 15 of FCC Rules, which provide reasonable protection against such interference in a residential installation. In the unlikely event that there is interference to radio or television reception (which can be determined by removing the unit's batteries and ac adapter), try the following:

- Reorienting or relocating the receiving antenna.
- Relocating the port replicator with respect to the receiver.
- Connecting the port replicator ac adapter to another power outlet.

To maintain compliance with FCC Rules and Regulations, use properly shielded cables with this device.
